**JUDGMENT**

1 Pursuant to the “Order Regarding Plaintiff’s Motion for Default  
2 Judgment” [ECF No. 21] entered substantially contemporaneously herewith,  
3 and in accordance with Rules 55 and 58 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure,

4 It is hereby **ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED** as follows:

5 1. This Court possesses subject matter jurisdiction over the above-  
6 captioned action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331.

7 2. Defendants DOES 1-10 are **DISMISSED**.


8 3. The claims for relief of Plaintiff Latanya Williams arising under the  
9 Unruh Civil Rights Act and Disabled Persons Act are **DISMISSED** for lack of  
10 jurisdiction. The claims for negligence and violation of the Cal. Health and  
11 Safety Code are **DISMISSED**.

12 4. With respect to the claim for relief arising under the Americans  
13 with Disabilities Act of 1990, **JUDGMENT** is entered in **FAVOR** of Plaintiff  
14 Latanya Williams and **AGAINST** Defendant The Blues Laundromat, LLC, in  
15 the amount of \$1,962 (which consists of \$1,480 in attorney’s fees and \$482 in  
16 costs). In addition, Defendant The Blues Laundromat, LLC is **ORDERED** to  
17 provide an accessible parking space at the property located at or about 838 W.  
18 Holt Ave., Pomona, California, in compliance with the Americans with  
19 Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines.

20 5. To the extent that any party requests any other form of relief, such  
21 request is **DENIED**.

22 **IT IS SO ORDERED.**
