15	Petitioner Albert Cecil Howard ("Howard") commenced this action on October 25, 1993 by		
16	filing a combined application for appointment of counsel and request for a stay of execution of his death		
17	sentence. Through counsel, he timely filed a petition in this Court on March 14, 1997 containing		
18	exhausted and unexhausted claims (doc. 79) (the "federal petition"). As part of his prayer for relief, he		
19	requested the Court to hold federal proceedings in abeyance to permit exhaustion of his state remedies		
20	before the California Supreme Court. On April 23, 1997, Howard filed a petition for a writ of habeas		
21	corpus in the California Supreme Court (the "state petition"). Over the objection of Respondent Robert		
22	K. Wong, as Acting Warden of San Quentin State Prison (the "Warden"), the Court entered an order		
23	holding federal proceedings in abeyance on May 30, 1997 (doc. 89). On November 1, 2005, Howard		
24	reported to the Court his expectation that the California Supreme Court would soon issue an order on		
25	the state petition (see doc. 132), and accordingly, he filed his amended federal petition on November 1,		
26	2005 (doc. 133) (the "amended federal petition"). From March 1, 2006, forward, Howard filed quarterly

1	status reports outlining the progress of state exhaustion proceedings before the California Supreme		
2	Court. His final status report was filed on June 2, 2009 (doc. 155).		
3	On January 19, 2010, Howard's appointed attorney filed a notice that Howard died on August		
4	12, 2009 (doc. 156). The delay in filing this notice arose because of errors contained in the Marin		
5	County death certificate and efforts to get that certificate corrected.		
6	In light of Howard's death, this federal habeas corpus action IS DISMISSED.		
7	The Clerk is directed to enter judgment forthwith.
