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1	In accordance with the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(c) and Local Rule 304, this	
2	Court has conducted a <u>de novo</u> review of this case. Defendants argue Plaintiff's claims are barred	
3	by <u>Heck v. Humphrey</u> , 512 U.S. 477 (1994) and <u>Edwards v. Balisok</u> , 520 U.S. 641 (1997) because	
4	a finding in Plaintiff's favor would require a reversal of Plaintiff's Rules Violation Report in which	
5	Plaintiff was found guilty of battery on a peace officer. (ECF No. 92.) In this matter, Plaintiff's	
6	claims would be barred by <u>Heck</u> if a finding in his favor would affect his loss of good time credits.	
7	Defendants fail to explain why even though Plaintiff was found guilty of a battery, his actual loss	
8	of good time credits was for assault rather than battery. In this case, a finding in Plaintiff's favor	
9	would not affect his loss of good time credits for assault. Having carefully reviewed the entire file,	
10	the Court finds the Findings and Recommendations to be supported by the record and by proper	
11	analysis.	
12	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:	
13	1. The Findings and Recommendations, filed November 30, 2012, are adopted in full;	
14	and	
15	2. Defendants Lozano and Mason's motion for summary judgment is DENIED.
