Furthermore, the claim arose in Riverside County and no facts are alleged in the 28 complaint against defendants residing in this district. It is clear that the center of gravity of this case

is in the Central District, and that any relationship with this division is minimal. Therefore, plaintiff's claim should have been filed in the United States District Court for the Central District of California. In the interest of justice, a federal court may transfer a complaint filed in the wrong district to the correct district. See 28 U.S.C. § 1406(a); Starnes v. McGuire, 512 F.2d 918, 932 (D.C. Cir. 1974). Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this matter is transferred to the United States District Court for the Central District of California. IT IS SO ORDERED.
