On December 9, 2009, Plaintiff filed a response, categorized as objections. (Docs. 66, 67.)

Plaintiff contends that the fictitious name usage should continue because Plaintiff remains a particularly vulnerable inmate, being a victim of sexual assault and a preoperative transgendered individual. Plaintiff is serving a life sentence and thus may eventually be transferred back to Pleasant Valley State Prison. Plaintiff suggests that the Court permit Plaintiff to proceed under the fictitious name of "LGBTQ Inmates" or "Transgender Inmates" because this suit would obviously affect this particular suspect class.

The Court will not utilize any fictitious name that indicates multiple plaintiffs. That would be misleading and cause more confusion. However, the Court will continue to permit Plaintiff to proceed as J. Doe in this action.

Based on the foregoing, the Court will continue to permit Plaintiff to proceed with the fictitious name J. Doe in this action. The Clerk of Court will write Plaintiff's real name on any court mail for purposes of mail delivery only.
