The Court has fully considered the briefs and evidence filed in support of the Motion for Temporary Restraining Order filed by San Luis Plaintiffs, and the oral arguments, testimony and documents admitted in evidence. Accordingly, the Court now enters the 10 following order:

11 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Motion for Temporary 12 Restraining Order is GRANTED. The Court further ORDERS 13 as follows:

1. The United States Department of the Interior and 15 its Bureau of Reclamation and the National Marine 16 Fisheries Service, and all those acting for, under or in 17 18 concert with them, shall be and are hereby restrained and 19 enjoined from implementing Action IV.2.3 of the 2009 20 Salmonid Biological Opinion RPA. This Temporary 21 Restraining Order shall initially remain in place through 22 February 19, 2010, subject to a renewal by Plaintiffs 23 upon an affirmative showing that neither the species nor 24 their critical habitat will be jeopardized by continued 25 injunction of RPA Action IV.2.3. 26

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1	2. Plaintiffs shall post a bond in the amount of
2	\$5,000.00.
3	3. This Temporary Restraining Order is issued without
4	prejudice to Defendants showing changed conditions that
5	threaten jeopardy to the species and their critical
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7	habitat.
