Pham, but provided Plaintiff with leave to file a second amended complaint or alternatively proceed only

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as to his claims against Defendant Lasley. (Doc. 25.)

Additionally, on November 21, 2011, the Court issued its Findings and Recommendations, recommending that all of Plaintiff's state law claims be dismissed. (Doc. 25.) More specifically, the Court found that Plaintiff had failed to comply with the California Tort Claims Act in failing to commence his federal suit as to Defendants Pham and Lasley within six months of the time in which his administrative complaint filed with the state government claims board was rejected. (Id. at 7-9.) On December 09, 2011, Plaintiff filed his objections to the findings and recommendations. (Doc. 26.)

In accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1) and Local Rule 302, the Court has conducted a <u>de novo</u> review of this case. Having carefully reviewed the entire file, the Court finds the findings and recommendations to be supported by the record and proper analysis.

Accordingly, it is **HEREBY ORDERED** that:

- 1. The findings and recommendations issued November 21, 2011, are adopted in full;
- Plaintiff's state law claims against Defendants Pham and Lasley for medical malpractice, oppressive conduct, and violations of his due process rights as afforded under the California Constitution are **DISMISSED**; and
- 3. This action shall proceed on Plaintiff's claim regarding Defendant Lasley's delay in providing treatment and denial of Plaintiff's request to seek treatment from outside providers violated his due process rights afforded under the Fourteenth Amendment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
