returned by the U.S. Postal Service, and if such plaintiff fails to notify the Court and opposing parties within sixty-three (63) days thereafter of a current address, the Court may dismiss the action without prejudice for failure to prosecute.

Without the ability to communicate with Petitioner, the Court is unable to maintain and faithfully adjudicate the present matter. Over sixty-three (63) days have passed and Petitioner has not informed the Court and any opposing parties of his present address.

<u>ORDER</u>

Accordingly, Petitioner is ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE why his petition should not be dismissed for failure to prosecute based on Petitioner's failure to inform the Court of his current address. Petitioner is ORDERED to inform the Court and any opposing counsel of his current address within fourteen (14) days of service of this order.

Petitioner is forewarned that failure to follow this order will result in dismissal of the petition without prejudice pursuant to Local Rules 110 and 183(b).

IT IS SO ORDERED.
