Dear Mr. Good,

I received your letter in which you state the food is being served in an unsanitary manner, you feel the mattresses are unsanitary, you have medical concerns and you are unable to get to the law library. First you should be discussing these issues with the staff at California Correctional Institution (CCI) in an attempt to resolve the issue at the lowest level.

You have an opportunity to appeal any departmental decision, action, condition or policy that you can demonstrate as having an adverse effect upon your welfare pursuant to California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Article 8, Section 3084.1. CCR, Section 3084.2 explains how to use a CDC Form 602, Inmate/Parolee Appeal Form, to describe the problem, action requested, and to forward it to the appeals coordinator. It is important that you file an appeal so issues regarding living conditions, medical and program may be tracked at the institution and processes/procedures improved.

CCI appeals office does not have any appeals from you regarding the issues you mentioned. Please remember appeal time limits are in working days, as indicated in CCR, Section 3084.6.

CCR, Title 15, Section 3354.2 (b) states inmates are provided the opportunity to report an illness or any other health problem and receive an evaluation of the condition and medically necessary treatment and follow up by health care staff. You are responsible for using the CDC Form 7362, Health Care Service Request to report a health problem, request a medical appointment, or request refills of his medication. The CDC Form 7362, Health Care Service Request, is available to inmate/patients in the housing units, clinics, Reception Centers, and/or from Health Care staff.

This letter does not extend your window to appeal the matters described in your letter. You may send me a copy of your appeal(s) for me to monitor the process.

Dear Mr. Good:

This is in response to your correspondence received by the Inmate Appeals Branch (IAB) on May 7, 2009, stating that you have submitted numerous appeals regarding unsanitary trashcans being used as make shift tables to serve food; mattresses are only 1/16 of a mattress or are rust covered, moldy, or smell of urine; showers every five to eight days on good days or ten to fifteen days apart on lock downs. You state that institution staff are throwing away your appeals.

It is the responsibility of the Chief, IAB, to investigate and respond to inmate/parolee appeals *after* the appellant has received a response to the appeal at the institution/parole region level, or Second Level of Response. The records maintained by the IAB reflect that you have no recent appeal history with this office.

IAB staff contacted the institution for further information. On May 20, 2009, K. Sampson, Institution Appeals Coordinator (IAC), reported that you submitted an Americans with Disability Act issue, CCI-0-09-00100, in addition to two letters complaining of health and safety issues and not receiving a response to appeals submitted. Lieutenant Traynham at Unit III interviewed you on May 11, 2009 and a written response was given to you stating, *"You were interviewed by Lt. Traynham on May 11, 2009 regarding your concerns with the processing appeals. You may resubmit your appeal to the appeals office for a log number and tracking."*

The IAB does not have available staff to track inmate appeals that are filed within the institutions. It is the responsibility of the hiring authority to oversee the appeals system within the institution and to supervise the IAC's to ensure that the appeals are processed in accordance with departmental regulations governing inmate appeals. Therefore, I recommend that you contact the hiring authority if you still have concerns regarding the processing of appeals you have submitted to the IAC.

The California Code of Regulations, Title 15, Section (CCR) 3084.1. Right to Appeal. (a) states in part, "Any inmate or parolee under the department's jurisdiction may appeal any departmental decision, action, condition, or policy which they can demonstrate as having an adverse effect upon their welfare...."

Department Operations Manual 54100.3. Responsibility states in part, "Each warden ... shall implement the appeal procedure and shall ensure it operates with specified policies as set forth herein.

- At least one staff member, at not less than a CC-II, shall be designated as the appeals coordinator in each institution ...

- The appeals coordinator shall process all appeals, monitor the system, prepare the quarterly appeals report, recommend corrective action where indicated, and work with the IST officer to see that training on the appeals procedure is carried out....”

Plaintiff is a state prisoner proceeding pro se in a civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Plaintiff filed the complaint commencing this action on February 27, 2009, at the United States District Court for the Southern District of California. The action was transferred to the Eastern District of California on March 17, 2009 and received by this court on October 9, 2009.

Plaintiff purports to bring a class action on behalf of himself and other inmates at CCI, based on claims that various conditions at CCI violate the Eighth and Fourteenth Amendments. However, plaintiff is not an attorney and is proceeding without counsel. A non-attorney proceeding pro se may bring his own claims to court, but may not represent others. Fymbo v. State Farm Fire & Casualty

1 Co., 213 F.3d 1320, 1321 (2000); Johns v. County of San Diego, 114 F.3d 874, 876 (9th Cir. 1997);  
2 C. E. Pope Equity Trust v. United States, 818 F.2d 696, 697 (9th Cir. 1987). A pro se litigant simply  
3 cannot “fairly and adequately protect the interests of the class.” Fed. R. Civ. P. 23(a)(4); Fymbo, 213  
4 F.3d at 1321. Therefore, this action will be construed as an individual civil suit brought by plaintiff  
5 rather than as a class action. Plaintiff John Good shall proceed as the sole plaintiff.

6 Plaintiff has not paid the \$350.00 filing fee, or submitted an application to proceed in forma  
7 pauperis pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915 on the proper form for this court.

8 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 9 1. This action is construed as an individual civil suit rather than as a class action, and  
10 plaintiff John Good shall proceed as the sole plaintiff;
- 11 2. The Clerk is directed to reflect on the court’s docket that John Good is the sole  
12 plaintiff in this action;
- 13 3. Within forty-five (45) days of the date of service of this order, plaintiff shall submit  
14 the attached application to proceed in forma pauperis, completed and signed, or in the  
15 alternative, pay the \$350.00 filing fee for this action;
- 16 4. Within sixty (60) days of the date of service of this order, plaintiff shall submit a  
17 certified copy of his prison trust statement for the six month period immediately  
18 preceding the filing of the complaint;
- 19 5. No requests for extension of time will be granted without a showing of good cause;  
20 and
- 21 6. Failure to comply with this order will result in a recommendation that this action be  
22 dismissed.

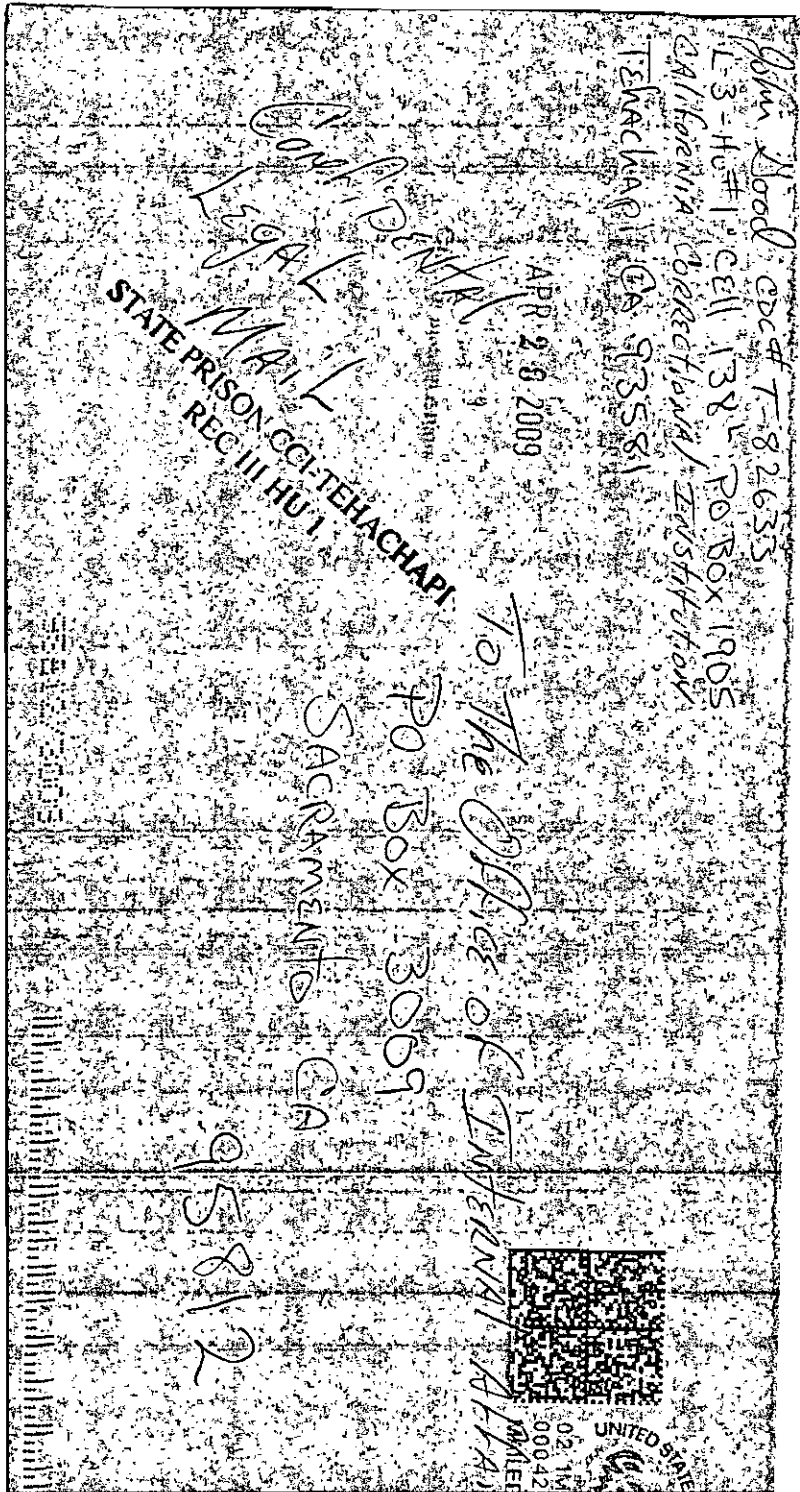

Dear Mr. Good:

This is in response to your correspondence received by the Inmate Appeals Branch (IAB) on May 7, 2009, stating that you have submitted numerous appeals regarding unsanitary trashcans being used as make shift tables to serve food; mattresses are only 1/16 of a mattress or are rust covered, moldy, or smell of urine; showers every five to eight days on good days or ten to fifteen days apart on lock downs. You state that institution staff are throwing away your appeals.

It is the responsibility of the Chief, IAB, to investigate and respond to inmate/parolee appeals *after* the appellant has received a response to the appeal at the institution/parole region level, or Second Level of Response. The records maintained by the IAB reflect that you have no recent appeal history with this office.

IAB staff contacted the institution for further information. On May 20, 2009, K. Sampson, Institution Appeals Coordinator (IAC), reported that you submitted an Americans with Disability Act issue, CCI-0-09-00100, in addition to two letters complaining of health and safety issues and not receiving a response to appeals submitted. Lieutenant Traynham at Unit III interviewed you on May 11, 2009 and a written response was given to you stating, *"You were interviewed by Lt. Traynham on May 11, 2009 regarding your concerns with the processing appeals. You may resubmit your appeal to the appeals office for a log number and tracking."*

The IAB does not have available staff to track inmate appeals that are filed within the institutions. It is the responsibility of the hiring authority to oversee the appeals system within the institution and to supervise the IAC's to ensure that the appeals are processed in accordance with departmental regulations governing inmate appeals. Therefore, I recommend that you contact the hiring authority if you still have concerns regarding the processing of appeals you have submitted to the IAC.

The California Code of Regulations, Title 15, Section (CCR) 3084.1. Right to Appeal. (a) states in part, "Any inmate or parolee under the department's jurisdiction may appeal any departmental decision, action, condition, or policy which they can demonstrate as having an adverse effect upon their welfare...."

Department Operations Manual 54100.3. Responsibility states in part, "Each warden ... shall implement the appcal procedure and shall ensure it operates with specified policies as set forth herein.

- At least one staff member, at not less than a CC-II, shall be designated as the appeals coordinator in each institution ...
