15	Plaintiff Marcus Ruben Ellington ("Pla	aintiff") is a California state prisoner proceeding pro
16	se in this civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983, the Americans with Disabilities Act, and	
17	the Rehabilitation Act. The matter was referred to a United States Magistrate Judge pursuant to 28	
18	U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local Rule 302.	
19	On June 7, 2010, the Magistrate Judge filed a Findings and Recommendations that	
20	recommended dismissal of certain claims and defendants. The Findings and Recommendations	
21	were served on Plaintiff and contained notice to Plaintiff that any objection to the Findings and	
22	Recommendations was to be filed within twenty days. Plaintiff filed an Objection to the Findings	
23	and Recommendations on June 17, 2010.	
24	In accordance with the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1), this Court has conducted a de	
25	<u>novo</u> review of this case. Having carefully revi	iewed the entire file, the Court finds the Findings and
26	Recommendations to be supported by the record and by proper analysis.	
27	Plaintiff's contention that individual defendants are liable under the ADA is without merit.	
28	Plaintiff's contention that Defendants violated the Fourth Amendment, due process, and equal

1	protection is unsupported by the pleadings. Plaintiff's contention that all other defendants had "first	
2	hand knowledge" of the alleged violations is unsupported by the pleadings. The exhibits	
3	demonstrate only that Plaintiff grieved these issues. That alone does not demonstrate that the other	
4	defendants violated Plaintiff's constitutional rights.	
5	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:	
6	1. The <u>Findings and Recommendations</u> , filed June 7, 2010, is adopted in full;	
7	2. Defendants Patel, Castro, Guiang, N. Grannis, C. Hammond, S. Lopez, Ariarch,	
8	Schwarzenegger, K. Harrington, the Director of CDCR, and C. Kelso are	
9	DISMISSED from this action with prejudice for failure to state a claim;	
10	3. This action SHALL proceed on Plaintiff's first amended <u>complaint</u> , filed April 30,	
11	2010, against Defendant Akanno for violation of the Eighth Amendment and	
12	Defendant Kern Valley State Prison for violation of Title II of the Americans with	
13	Disabilities Act and § 504 of the Rehabilitation Act; and	
14	4. This action is referred to the Magistrate Judge for further proceedings.
