Six Unknown Named Agents of Federal Bureau 16 17 of Narcotics, 403 U.S. 388 (1971). The matter was referred to a United States Magistrate Judge 18 pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local Rule 302. 19 On December 27, 2010, the Magistrate Judge filed a Findings and Recommendation 20 recommending that Plaintiff's Motion for Preliminary Injunction be denied. (ECF No. 16.) 21 Plaintiff filed objections to the Findings and Recommendation. Plaintiff challenges the 22 Magistrate Judge's assertion that Plaintiff is actually seeking a mandatory injunction, and also argues that he has shown that he is likely to succeed on the merits of his case. In accordance with the 23 provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(c) and Local Rule 305, this Court has conducted a de novo 24 25 review of this case and has explicitly considered the objections raised by Plaintiff.
