17	Plaintiff is a California prisoner proceeding pro se with an action for violation of civil		
18	rights under 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Before the Court is Plaintiff's renewed motion for appointment of		
19	counsel. (Doc. 69)		
20	On December 3, 2012, plaintiff filed a motion to appoint counsel. (Doc. 39) On		
21	December 6, 2012, the court denied the motion without prejudice. (Doc. 41) On March 27, 2013,		
22	plaintiff filed another motion for appointment of counsel. (Doc. 69). At that time, the Court		
23	could not make a determination whether Plaintiff was likely to succeed on the merits. However,		
24	given the posture of the case at this time, it now appears Plaintiff has presented colorable claims		
25	which, if proven, may provide a successful result.		
26	Therefore, the Court finds that appointment of counsel for plaintiff is warranted at this		
27	time. Veronica L. Harris and Christoper A. Nedeau have been selected from the court's pro bono		
28	attorney panel to represent plaintiff, and they have accepted the appointment.		

1	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:	
2	1. Plaintiff's motion for the appointment of counsel is granted; and	
3	2. Veronica L. Harris and Christoper A. Nedeau are appointed as counsel in the	
4	above entitled matter.
