

1 recently extended to August 8, 2014 (Doc. 73). Plaintiff was given thirty days after service of
2 Defendants' responses to file a motion to compel further responses to deficient responses from
3 Defendants (Doc. 61), which is properly extended to September 7, 2014 (parallel to the extension
4 given to Defendants to serve their responses). These extensions surpass the current July 11, 2014
5 dispositive motion filing deadline, rendering modification appropriate.

6 Given the above extensions of discovery deadlines in this case, good cause exists to
7 extend the dispositive motion filing deadline.¹

8 Accordingly, based on the foregoing, it is HEREBY ORDERED nunc pro tunc that the
9 Discovery and Scheduling order is modified in part as follows:

- 10 1. Defendants SHALL serve their responses to Plaintiff's propounded discovery as
11 delineated in the order granting in part Defendants' motion for protective order
12 which issued on May 16, 2014 (Doc. 61) on or before **August 8, 2014**;
- 13 2. Plaintiff has 30 days from the date Defendants serve their discovery responses, on
14 or before **September 7, 2014**, to file a motion to compel if he has a legal basis on
15 which to conclude the responses are deficient;
- 16 3. Any dispositive motions SHALL be filed no later than **October 31, 2014**;
- 17 4. **A request for an extension of a deadline set in this order must be filed on or**
18 **before the expiration of the deadline in question**; and
- 19 5. **Extensions of time will only be granted on a showing of good cause.**
