16	Plaintiff is a federal prisoner in the custody of the U.S. Bureau of Prisons at the Federal Airpark	
17	Unit Correctional Center in Big Spring, Texas. To date, Plaintiff has filed approximately one-hundred	
18	forty civil cases in this district. The complaint in this action is both rambling and incoherent, and fails	
19	to state any cognizable claims under federal law. See Ashcroft v. Iqbal, 129 S.Ct. 1937, 1949 (2009);	
20	Bell Atlantic Corp. v. Twombly, 550 U.S. 544, 555, 127 S.Ct. 1955, 1965 (2007). Given this litigant's	
21	abusive filing practices in this district, and the utterly incoherent pleading before the Court, leave to	
22	amend is not warranted. See Lopez v. Smith, 203 F.3d 1122, 1130 (9th Cir. 2000).	
23	Accordingly, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915A, this action is HEREBY DISMISSED WITH	
24	PREJUDICE.
