16	Plaintiff Jason Deaver, a state prisoner proceeding pro se and in forma pauperis, filed this	
17	civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983 on October 17, 2011. The matter was referred to a	
18	United States Magistrate Judge pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local Rule 302.	
19	On November 7, 2012, the Magistrate Judge screened Plaintiff's amended complaint and	
20	recommended that this action proceed on Plaintiff's claim against Defendant Narayan for denial of	
21	adequate medical care.1 28 U.S.C. § 1915A. Plaintiff filed a statement of non-opposition on	
22	December 13, 2012. Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(C), the Court has conducted a <i>de novo</i>	
23	review of this case. Having carefully reviewed the entire file, the Court finds the findings and	
24	recommendations to be supported by the record and by proper analysis.

1	Accordingly, it is HEREBY ORDERED that:	
2	1. The Court adopts the findings and recommendations filed on November 7, 2012, in	
3	full;	
4	2. This action shall proceed as one for damages against Defendant Narayan for denial	
5	of adequate medical care;	
6	3. Defendant Mims is dismissed, with prejudice, based on Plaintiff's failure to state a	
7	claim against her under section 1983; and	
8	4. Plaintiff's claim for injunctive relief is dismissed as moot.
