AND AGAINST DEFENDANT 17 18 19 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED, by and between the parties, through their respective 20 counsel of record, that this action be remanded to the Commissioner of Social Security for further administrative action pursuant to section 205(g) of the Social Security Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 21 § 405(g), sentence four. 22 Remand is required because the administrative law judge (ALJ) relied on a medical 23 source opinion that is incomplete and has pages missing. On remand, the administrative law 24 judge (ALJ) will fully develop the record and offer the claimant an opportunity for a new hearing. 25 The ALJ will attempt to contact the medical sources for clarification of their opinions; will further 26 evaluate the claimant's impairments and subjective complaints; will determine the claimant's 27 residual functional capacity, with consideration of the opinions and evidence of record; and issue 28

1 a new decision. 2 The parties further request that the Clerk of the Court be directed to enter a final judgment in favor of Plaintiff, and against Defendant, Commissioner of Social Security, reversing the final 3 decision of the Commissioner. The parties agree that no aspect of the Commissioner's final 4 decision is affirmed and that the ALJ will render a de novo decision on remand.
