Matthew James Dury ("plaintiff") is a state prisoner proceeding pro se in this civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. The matter was referred to a United States Magistrate Judge pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local Rule 302.

On April 3, 2013, <u>findings and recommendations</u> were entered, recommending that Plaintiff's motions for preliminary injunctive relief filed on November 13, 2012 and December 17, 2012 be denied. Plaintiff was provided an opportunity to file objections to the findings and recommendations within thirty days.
