He has consented to the jurisdiction of the Magistrate Judge 16 pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(c). 17 On December 13, 2012, the Court dismissed the petition and terminated the case. 18 Judgment was entered on the same date. On October 3, 2013, Petitioner filed the instant request 19 for a default judgment. Petitioner complains that the California Supreme Court has not acted on 20 his petition for review of his claims within a reasonable time period. Petitioner is advised that 21 his federal habeas case was terminated on December 13, 2012. Therefore, the motion must be 22 denied for lack of jurisdiction. In addition, federal courts do not exercise supervisory powers 23 over state courts. Victor v. Nebraska, 511 U.S. 1 (1994). Petitioner's remedy lies with the state 24 court. 25 /// 26 /// 27
