18	page limit set by the Court's standing order. (ECF No. 49). The defendants state that they need	
19	up to twenty-five pages to address Plaintiff's opposition because it is forty-two pages, and	
20	includes an additional "208 or so pages of 'evidence." (Id.).	
21	The Court will grant the defendants' request. The defendants reply will be limited to	
22	twenty-five pages.	
23	However, the Court notes that it is unaware of a standing order limiting replies to 10	
24	pages.	
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1	Good cause having been presented to the Court and GOOD CAUSE APPEARING	
2	THEREFOR, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the defendants' reply to Plaintiff's opposition to	
3	the defendants' motion for summary judgment is limited to twenty-five pages.
