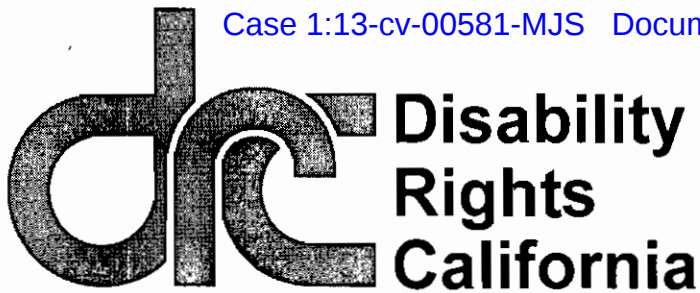

This memorandum is in response to your complaint dated and received 2/20/13 about staff members working in the medication room.

Based on the information in your complaint, it seems you have been prescribed medications as part of your medical care and treatment plan. If you have concerns about staff working in the medication room, these matters can be better addressed at this time by the Shift Lead or by Unit Supervisor Samantha Perryman.

If you are not satisfied with the response and/or action taken on a patients' rights complaint, you may, within 10 working days, Appeal the complaint to the hospital Executive Director (ED) for review and response. The ED shall take action to review the complaint and issue a response within 15 working days. You must include the complaint and response(s) you received with the complaint when making an Appeal.
