17	Plaintiff Lonnie Williams ("Plaintiff") is a prisoner in the custody of the California	
18	Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation ("CDCR"). Plaintiff is proceeding pro se and in	
19	forma pauperis in this civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. On August 26, 2013, the	
20	Court issued an order dismissing the complaint, with leave to amend, for failure to state a claim.	
21	(ECF No. 6.) Plaintiff was given thirty days to file an amended complaint and was cautioned that	
22	the failure to do so would result in the dismissal of this action for failure to state a claim. <i>Id.</i> More	
23	than thirty days has passed, and Plaintiff has not complied with or otherwise responded to the	
24	Court's order. As a result, there is no pleading on file which sets forth any claims upon which relief	
25	may be granted.

based on Plaintiff's failure to state a claim.
