(ECF No. 57.) 22 23 On June 23, 2015, Defendants filed a motion for summary judgment for Plaintiff's failure to 24 exhaust the administrative remedies. (ECF No. 70.) On July 7, 2015, the Court granted Defendants' request to stay merits-based discovery pending 25 26 the motion for summary judgment. (ECF No. 72.) 27 /// 28 ///
