25 **ORDER**

26 The parties have stipulated to dismiss this matter and, in doing so, rely upon Federal Rules
27 of Civil Procedure Rule 41(a). Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 41(a)(1) provides, “the plaintiff

1 may dismiss an action without a court order by filing: . . . a stipulation of dismissal signed by all
2 parties who have appeared.” . . .” Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a). Once such a notice has been filed, an order
3 of the Court is not required to make the dismissal effective. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(ii); Wilson v.
4 City of San Jose, 111 F.3d 688, 692 (9th Cir. 1997). Thus, the Clerk of Court is DIRECTED to
5 close this action in light of the stipulation as dictated by Rule 41(a).
