Although captioned as a motion, the pleading presents as an amended complaint. Under 22 Fed. R. Civ. P. 15(a), a party may amend its pleading once as a matter of course within 21 days 23 after serving it. Here, the initial complaint has not yet been screened and served. Therefore, 24 25 Plaintiff may amend his complaint as a matter of course. /// 26 27 /// 28 ///
