18	Plaintiff Sammy R. Quair, Sr. ("Plaintiff") is a former state prisoner proceeding pro se and	
19	in forma pauperis in this civil rights action under 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Plaintiff initiated this action	
20	on October 16, 2014. (ECF No. 1.)	
21	On November 16, 2016, the Court issued a screening order dismissing Plaintiff's first	
22	amended complaint with leave to amend within thirty (30) days. (ECF No. 32.) The Court	
23	expressly warned Plaintiff that the failure to file an amended complaint in compliance with the	
24	Court's order would result in this action being dismissed for failure to obey a court order and	
25	failure to state a claim. (Id. at 6.) The deadline for Plaintiff to file an amended complaint has	
26	expired, and he has not complied with or otherwise responded to the Court's order.	
27	Accordingly, the Court HEREBY ORDERS that Plaintiff shall show cause in writing,	
28	within twenty (20) days of service of this order, why this action should not be dismissed for

1	Plaintiff's failure to comply with the Court's November 16, 2016 order, for failure to state a	
2	claim, and for failure to prosecute. Plaintiff can comply with this order to show cause by filing a	
3	second amended complaint. The failure to respond to this order will result in the dismissal of	
4	this action, with prejudice, for failure to state a claim, failure to obey a court order, and	
5	<u>failure to prosecute</u> .
