

1 move for transcripts at the government's expense under limited circumstances, see 28
2 U.S.C. §§ 753(f) and 1915(c), those circumstances are not present here. See Tedder v.
3 Odel, 890 F.2d 210, 211 (9th Cir. 1989) (“[T]he expenditure of public funds [on behalf of
4 an indigent litigant] is proper only when authorized by Congress....”) (internal quotations
5 omitted). If Plaintiff wishes to obtain copies of deposition transcripts for his own records,
6 he must pay for them. Fed. R. Civ. P. 30(f)(3).

7 Accordingly, Plaintiff's motion for deposition transcripts at the government's
8 expense is DENIED.
