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20	On January 13, 2015, Plaintiff filed a notice of voluntary dismissal of defendant James	
21	Clayton Wong without prejudice pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(a)(1)(A)(i).	
22	In relevant part, Rule 41(a)(1)(A) provides as follows:	
23	[A] plaintiff may dismiss an action with a court order by filing: (i) a notice of	
24	dismissal before the opposing party serves either an answer or a motion for summary judgment; or (ii) a stipulation of dismissal signed by all parties who	
25	have appeared.	
26	Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A). "The plaintiff may dismiss some or all of the defendants, or some	
27	or all of his claims, through a Rule 41(a)(1) notice," and the dismissal "automatically	
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terminates the action as to the defendants who are the subjects of the notice." Wilson v. City of San Jose, 111 F.3d 688, 692 (9th Cir. 1997). Because Plaintiff filed a notice of dismissal of defendant Wong without prejudice under Rule 41(a)(1)(A)(i), the claims against that defendant have been automatically terminated. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A)(i). Accordingly IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is to administratively update the docket to reflect that all claims against defendant James Clayton Wong have been dismissed, and he is terminated from the lawsuit.
