13 **[PROPOSED] ORDER**

14 As detailed above, the parties have stipulated to dismiss the action with each side to bear
15 their own fees and costs. (Doc. 92) The stipulation relies upon Fed.R.Civ.P. 41, which permits the
16 plaintiff to dismiss an action without a court order “by filing . . . a stipulation of dismissal signed
17 by all parties who have appeared.” Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A)(ii). Because all parties who have
18 appeared in the action signed the stipulation, it “automatically terminate[d] the action.” *Wilson v.*
19 *City of San Jose*, 111 F.3d 688, 692 (9th Cir. 1997). Accordingly, the Clerk of Court is
20 **DIRECTED** to close this action.
