10	Plaintiff Phillip Sanders ("Plaintiff") filed a complaint on March 12, 2015 and an		
20	application to proceed <i>in forma pauperis</i> on that same day. (ECF Nos. 1, 2). Plaintiff has made		
21	the required showing pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a). Accordingly, the request to proceed in		
22	forma pauperis is GRANTED.		
23	Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2), the Court conducts an initial review of all <i>pro se</i>		
24	complaints for legal sufficiency. The Court must dismiss a complaint or portion thereof if it		
25			
26	determines that the action is legally "frivolous or malicious," fails to state a claim upon which		
27	relief may be granted, or seeks monetary relief from a defendant who is immune from such relief		
28	28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2). If the Court determin	tes that the complaint fails to state a claim, leave to	
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1	amend may be granted to the extent that the deficiencies of the complaint may be cured by	
2	amendment. Plaintiff is advised that the Court will screen his complaint in due course and issue	
3	an order addressing the legal sufficiency of his claims. The Court's screening order will be served	
4	on Plaintiff by U.S. mail.
