While filed as a habeas petition, a review of the filing indicates that Plaintiff is challenging the conditions of confinement. Even if the Court were to review this case as a habeas petition it would still be transferred as Plaintiff was found guilty in 1980 in Los Angeles which is located in the Central District of California.

Plaintiff, a state prisoner currently incarcerated at California State Prison - Corcoran, has filed a <u>pro se</u> civil rights Complaint under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 alleging that his mail privileges have been restricted which has unfairly affected his sentence.

California State Prison - Corcoran is located in Kings County,

which lies in the Eastern District of California. Thus, the events or omissions giving rise to Plaintiff's claims occurred in the Eastern District of California. See 28 U.S.C. § 84(b). Venue therefore properly lies in the Eastern District. See 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b). Accordingly, in the interest of justice and pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1406(a), this action is transferred to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of California.
