| 25 | Modification of the pretrial scheduling order requires a showing of good cause. Fed. R.        |   |
| 26 | Civ. P. 16(b)(4). "The schedule may be modified 'if it cannot reasonably be met despite the    |   |
| 27 | diligence of the party seeking the extension." Zivkovic v. Southern California Edison Co., 302 |   |
| 28 | F.3d 1080, 1087 (9th Cir. 2002) (quoting Johnson v. Mammoth Recreations, Inc., 975 F.2d 604,   |   |

609 (9th Cir. 1992)). "Although the existence or degree of prejudice to the party opposing the modification might supply additional reasons to deny a motion, the focus of the inquiry is upon the moving party's reasons for seeking the modification." *Johnson*, 975 F.2d at 609. "If the party seeking the modification 'was not diligent, the inquiry should end' and the motion to modify should not be granted." Zivkovic, 302 F.3d at 1087 (quoting Johnson, 975 F.2d at 609). Here, Defendants seek a thirty-day extension of the August 10, 2016, dispositive motion deadline due to counsel's heavy case load and upcoming travel schedule. Hemple Decl. ¶5-6. Defendants have been diligent in litigating this action, and there is no indication that Plaintiff will be prejudiced by a thirty-day extension. Accordingly, Defendants' motion is GRANTED.
