In order to appeal a non-final judgment under 28 U.S.C. § 1291, Plaintiff must show that the order he is appealing from "must 'conclusively determine the disputed question,' 'resolve an important issue completely separate from the merits of the action,' and 'be effectively unreviewable on appeal from a final judgment."" Richardson-Merrell, Inc. v. Koller, 472 U.S. 424, 431 (1985) (quoting Coopers & Lybrand v. Livesay, 437 U.S. 463, 468 (1978)); Lauro Lines s.r.l. v. Chasser, 490 U.S. 495, 498 (1989). Plaintiff's motion will be denied. Plaintiff did not provide a reason why the case should be stayed pending appeal, and the Court sees none. Additionally, it does not appear that Plaintiff filed a legitimate interlocutory appeal. Accordingly, based on the foregoing, IT IS ORDERED that Plaintiff's motion to stay all proceedings pending appellate review is DENIED. IT IS SO ORDERED. Is/ Erici P.
