ZUNIGA, et al., (ECF No. 10) 14 Defendants. 15 16 Plaintiff is a state prisoner proceeding pro se and in forma pauperis in this civil 17 rights action brought pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1983. The action proceeds against 18 Defendant Musleh on Plaintiff's Eighth Amendment failure to protect claim. Service on 19 Defendant Musleh is pending. 20 On July 6, 2015, Plaintiff consented to have a United States Magistrate Judge 21 conduct all further proceedings in this case, including trial and entry of final judgment, 22 pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(c)(1). (ECF No. 6.) Defendant has yet to appear in the 23 action. Before the Court is Plaintiff's May 13, 2016 request to withdraw his consent to 24 Magistrate Judge jurisdictioin. 25 "A party to a federal civil case has, subject to some exceptions, a constitutional 26 right to proceed before an Article III judge." Dixon v. Ylst, 990 F.2d 478, 479 (9th Cir. 27 2003). This right can be waived, allowing parties to consent to have any and all further 28

proceedings conducted before a Magistrate Judge. <u>Id.</u> at 479-80. There is no absolute right to withdraw consent to proceeding before a Magistrate Judge. <u>Id.</u> at 480. Instead, a motion to withdraw consent may be granted only for good cause or a showing of extraordinary circumstances. <u>Id.</u>; <u>see also</u> 28 U.S.C. § 636(c)(4).

Here, Plaintiff provides no basis for seeking to withdraw his consent. Accordingly, his request is HEREBY DENIED.
