17	On May 30, 2017, Plaintiff filed a notice of voluntary dismissal of this action. (Doc. 13.)	
18	Although not stated in Plaintiff's request, the Court construes it as one made pursuant to Federal	
19	Rule of Civil Procedure 41(a)(1)(i).	
20	In Wilson v. City of San Jose, the Ninth Circuit explained:	
21	Under Rule 41(a)(1), a plaintiff has an absolute right to voluntarily dismiss his	
22	action prior to service by the defendant of an answer or a motion for summary judgment. <i>Concha v. London</i> , 62 F.3d 1493, 1506 (9th Cir. 1995) (citing	
23	<i>Hamilton v. Shearson-Lehman American Express</i> , 813 F.2d 1532, 1534 (9th Cir. 1987)). A plaintiff may dismiss his action so long as the plaintiff files a notice of	
24	dismissal prior to the defendant's service of an answer or motion for summary judgment. The dismissal is effective on filing and no court order is required. <i>Id</i> .	
25	The plaintiff may dismiss some or all of the defendants, or some or all of his	
26	claims, through a Rule 41(a)(1) notice. <i>Id.</i> ; <i>Pedrina v. Chun</i> , 987 F.2d 608, 609-10 (9th Cir. 1993). The filing of a notice of voluntary dismissal with the court	
27	•	as to the defendants who are the subjects of 06. Unless otherwise stated, the dismissal is
28		laintiff's right to commence another action for

1	the same cause against the same defendants. Id. (citing McKenzie v. Davenport- Harris Funeral Home, 834 F.2d 930, 934-35 (9th Cir. 1987)). Such a dismissal	
2	leaves the parties as though no action had been brought. <i>Id</i> .	
3	Wilson v. City of San Jose, 111 F.3d 688, 692 (9th Cir. 1997).	
4	Neither answers to Plaintiff's Complaint, nor motions for summary judgment have been	
5	filed in this case and it appears that no such answers or summary judgment motions have been	
6	served. Because Plaintiff has exercised his right to voluntarily dismiss the complaint under Rule	
7	41(a)(1), this case has terminated. See Wilson, 111 F.3d at 692.	
8	Therefore, the Clerk of the Court is DIRECTED to close this case in light of Plaintiff's	
9	Rule 41(a)(1)(i) requested dismissal.
