SEND PLAINTIFF A COPY OF FINDINGS 16 AND RECOMMENDATIONS 17 OBJECTIONS, IF ANY, DUE WITHIN TWENTY-ONE DAYS 18 19 20 Manuel Antonio Gonzalez ("Plaintiff") is a state prisoner, and is the plaintiff in this civil 21 rights action filed pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983, which includes attendant state law claims. 22 On January 3, 2017, Plaintiff filed what the Court construes as a motion for a preliminary 23 injunction ("the Motion"). (ECF No. 34). According to the Motion, Plaintiff requested a 24 hardship transfer because his father is dying. The I.C.C. committee approved a hardship transfer 25 to R.J. Donovan (Plaintiff's first choice), C.S.P. Los Angeles, or Calipatria State Prison. 26 However, the C.S.R., D. Hicinbothon, processed a transfer to High Desert State Prison, where 27

Plaintiff would never see his dying father again. Plaintiff believes that this transfer is being done

1	in retaliation for his ongoing civil case. Plaintiff requests that the Court stop the transfer to High
2	Desert State Prison, and order that Plaintiff instead be transferred to R.J. Donovan, C.S.P. Los
3	Angeles, or Calipatria State Prison.
4	The Court will recommend that Plaintiff's motion be denied as moot. A recent filing by
5	Plaintiff (ECF No. 41) indicates that Plaintiff was transferred to R.J. Donovan (his first choice),
6	not High Desert State Prison.
7	Accordingly, based on the foregoing, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that the
8	Motion be DENIED as moot.
9	These Findings and Recommendations will be submitted to the United States District Court
10	Judge assigned to this action pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636 (b)(1). Within
11	twenty-one (21) days after being served with a copy of these Findings and Recommendations,
12	any party may file written objections with the court and serve a copy on all parties. Such a
13	document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and
14	Recommendations." Any reply to the objections shall be served and filed within ten (10) days
15	after service of the objections. The parties are advised that failure to file objections within the
16	specified time may result in the waiver of rights on appeal. Wilkerson v. Wheeler, 772 F.3d 834,
17	839 (9th Cir. 2014) (citing <u>Baxter v. Sullivan</u> , 923 F.2d 1391, 1394 (9th Cir. 1991)).
18	Additionally, IT IS ORDERED that the Clerk of Court is directed to send Plaintiff a copy
19	of these findings and recommendations.

21	IT IS SO ORDERED.
