2 2. In September 2014, Cesar Navejar was employed by the Kern County Department of
3 Probation as a Juvenile Corrections Officer II.

4 **D. DISPUTED FACTS**

5 All other facts, not set forth above, remain in dispute including the following:

6 1. Whether Defendant Navejar sexually abused Plaintiff.

7 2. Whether any sexual abuse of Plaintiff involved violence, threats, or coercion.

8 3. The nature and extent of Plaintiff's damages, if any.

9 4. The availability and amount of any punitive damages.

10 5. Whether alleged deficient customs, practices, and policies at Juvenile Hall were a
11 substantial factor in causing the sexual abuse of Plaintiff.

12 6. Whether alleged deficient training of Juvenile Hall employees was a substantial factor
13 in causing the sexual abuse of Plaintiff.

14 7. Whether the County of Kern ratified Defendant Navejar's alleged misconduct or
15 maintained a policy of inaction.

16 8. Whether Defendant Navejar was acting in the course and scope of his employment.

17 9. Whether there was negligent supervision, hiring, or retention on the part of the County.

18 **E. DISPUTED EVIDENTIARY ISSUES**

19 Plaintiff:

20 1. Plaintiffs dispute and intend to move to exclude each of the witnesses on Defendants'
21 exhibit list, with the exception of Mimi Wollitz. Plaintiff intends to move for relief on the grounds of
22 relevance, improper character evidence, and Rule 403. Further, Plaintiff intends to move to exclude
23 these witnesses as untimely disclosed, to the extent they were omitted from the respective defendants'
24 initial disclosures. Defendant Navejar's purported supplemental Rule 26 disclosure, received after draft
25 witness lists were already exchanged for trial, does not cure this failure to disclose. Finally, some of
26 these individuals appear to be undisclosed experts, such as "Larry Yokoyama, M.D.," Defendant
27 Navejar's attorneys, investigators and district attorneys, and those who are described as unnamed
28 "Psychologist/Psychiatrists" who interacted with Plaintiff at various times.

1 2. Plaintiff contends that any evidence or allegations regarding her drug use would be
2 irrelevant, prejudicial, and improper character evidence.

3 3. Plaintiff contends that any evidence or allegations regarding her criminal or juvenile
4 history would be irrelevant, prejudicial, and improper character evidence. This also includes reports by
5 child protective services.

6 4. Plaintiff contends that any evidence or allegations regarding her education, grades, or
7 school records would be irrelevant, prejudicial, and improper character evidence.

8 5. Plaintiff contends that any evidence or allegations regarding her gang affiliation would
9 be irrelevant, prejudicial, and improper character evidence.

10 6. Plaintiff contends that any evidence or allegations regarding her sexual history
11 would be irrelevant, prejudicial, and improper character evidence. This would include any
12 sexual victimization that occurred or was alleged to have occurred in the past.

13 7. Plaintiff contends that any evidence or allegations regarding her prior history of
14 discipline at Juvenile Hall would be irrelevant, prejudicial, and improper character evidence.

15 8. Plaintiff contends that her Facebook or other social media posts are irrelevant,
16 prejudicial, and improper character evidence.

17 9. Plaintiff intends to move to exclude the testimony and opinions of defense expert
18 Judy Malmgren on the grounds of relevance, foundation, and the principles of *Daubert*.

19 10. Plaintiff intends to move to exclude any testimony and opinions of defense
20 expert Harold Seymour to the effect that the sexual abuse more probably did or did not occur.
21 In other words, Dr. Seymour's opinions should be limited to his diagnoses of Plaintiff and his
22 opinions regarding future treatment, and he should not opine regarding liability.

23 11. Plaintiff intends to move to exclude evidence that the criminal prosecution of
24 Defendant Navejar did not result in a guilty verdict.

25 12. Plaintiff contends that any exhibits or documents that have not been disclosed to
26 Plaintiff to date would be inadmissible. Plaintiff is in the process of reviewing Defendants'
27 exhibit list to ascertain which have not been previously disclosed. For example, no
28

1 photographs of the “plumbing fixture,” Defendants’ Exhibit 8, was ever disclosed. In addition,
2 to the extent that Defendants have obtained information through juvenile court petitions that
3 have not been disclosed to Plaintiff, Plaintiff contends that any such evidence would be
4 inadmissible.

5 13. Plaintiff contends that it would be improper to use negative information about
6 Plaintiff at trial to argue or suggest that she is “damaged goods” whose damages should be
7 reduced by reason of her prior experiences and traumas, and will seek an order limiting such
8 arguments.

9 14. Plaintiff contends that consent is not a defense or mitigating factor, and intends to
10 seek an order excluding any evidence that would bear on consent and also secure an appropriate
11 jury instruction.

12 15. Plaintiff contends that the jury should be instructed that if sexual contact
13 occurred, the jury should find in Plaintiff’s favor on all liability issues. In other words, there is
14 no sexual contact that would not violate Plaintiff’s rights or constitute a tort under the
15 circumstances.

16 16. Plaintiff contends that there is no comparative fault, comparative negligence,
17 qualified immunity, or failure to mitigate defense in this matter, and the jury should be so
18 instructed.

19 17. Plaintiff contends that Defendants are not entitled to any immunities under state
20 law.

21 18. Motion to preclude Defendants from putting on evidence or argument to the
22 effect that there were other wards in their rooms in Plaintiff’s wing of Pathways at the time of
23 the alleged sexual abuse.

24 19. Motion to preclude Defendants from putting on expert testimony, whether of
25 retained or non-retained experts, except for the three experts that were timely disclosed:
26 Heather Mauro, Harold Seymour, and Judy Malmgren.

15. Motion to preclude testimony and/or evidence of Maria Lopez regarding the "grunt" noise she thought Cesar Navejar made;
16. Motion to preclude the opinions of Detective Sporer regarding Cesar Navejar;
17. Motion to preclude the testimony and/or evidence of the absence of Cesar Navejar denying the sexual assault when arrested by Bakersfield Police Department detectives;

24 argument before the jury that suggests that jurors should base Plaintiffs’ damages on an amount that the
25 jurors would charge to endure similar injuries, or that would appeal to community standards or morals.

26 33. Request that the actual names of wards be used

27 34. Request to unseal only documents that are to be used as evidence

- 27 2. Responses Special Interrogatories, Set One, propounded by Defendant Cesar Navejar to
28 Plaintiff Jane Doe dated August 19, 2016;

1 3. Responses to Request for Admissions, Set One, propounded by Defendant Cesar Navejar to
2 Plaintiff Jane Doe dated August 17, 2016;

3 4. Responses to Request for Production, Set Two, by Defendant Navejar from Plaintiff Jane Doe
4 dated August 17, 2016;

5 5. All Rule 26 disclosures provided by Plaintiff Jane Doe, dated April 11, 2016, July 28, 2016,
6 and October 31, 2016;

7 6. Responses to Request for Production, Set One, by County of Kern from Plaintiff Jane Doe
8 dated August 19, 2016;

9 7. Responses to Special Interrogatories, Set One, by County of Kern from Plaintiff Jane Doe
10 dated August 19, 2016

11 **L. FURTHER DISCOVERY OR MOTIONS**

12 No further discovery or motions are contemplated, except that the parties expect to file motions
13 in limine.

14 Defendant Navejar currently has a motion for clarification on an 827 petition order pending
15 before the juvenile court.

16 **M. MOTIONS IN LIMINE**

17 Any party may file motions in limine. The purpose of a motion in limine is to establish in
18 advance of the trial that certain evidence should not be offered at trial. “Although the Federal Rules of
19 Evidence do not explicitly authorize in limine rulings, the practice has developed pursuant to the
20 district court’s inherent authority to manage the course of trials.” Luce v. United States, 469 U.S. 38,
21 40 n. 2 (1984); Jonasson v. Lutheran Child and Family Services, 115 F. 3d 436, 440 (7th Cir. 1997).
22 The Court will grant a motion in limine, and thereby bar use of the evidence in question, only if the
23 moving party establishes that the evidence clearly is not admissible for any valid purpose. Id.

24 **In advance of filing any motion in limine, counsel SHALL meet and confer to determine**
25 **whether they can resolve any disputes and avoid filing motions in limine. Along with their**
26 **motions in limine, the parties SHALL file a certification demonstrating counsel have in good**
27 **faith met and conferred and attempted to resolve the dispute. Failure to provide the**
28 **certification may result in the Court refusing to entertain the motion.**

1 Any motions in limine must be filed with the Court by **May 25, 2017**. The motion must
2 clearly identify the nature of the evidence that the moving party seeks to prohibit the other side from
3 offering at trial. Any opposition to the motion must be served on the other party, and filed with the
4 Court by **June 5, 2017**. The Court sets a hearing on the motions in limine on **June 19, 2017**, at 10:00
5 a.m. Appearances via Courtcall are authorized.

6 The parties are reminded they may still object to the introduction of evidence during trial.

7 **N. STIPULATIONS**

8 The parties have conferred and agree that Plaintiff's civil rights claim arises under the
9 Fourteenth Amendment. Accordingly, the Fourteenth Amendment standard should be used, not an
10 Eighth or Fourth Amendment standard.

11 The parties have entered into Stipulated Protective Orders pertaining to certain documents
12 produced by Defendants and the County of Kern that are deemed confidential. The parties have
13 stipulated that Plaintiff's experts, Daniel Marble and John Bacon, may only rely exclusively on
14 materials that were discovered in the Navejar case for their opinions.

15 **O. AMENDMENTS/ DISMISSALS**

16 None.

17 **P. SETTLEMENT NEGOTIATIONS**

18 **No later than May 12, 2017**, counsel **SHALL** file a joint statement indicating whether they
19 believe a settlement conference may be fruitful and if so, proposed dates for the settlement conference.

20 **Q. AGREED STATEMENT**

21 None

22 **R. SEPARATE TRIAL OF ISSUES**

23 The plaintiff contends that there should be no bifurcation as to punitive damages unless
24 defendant Navejar will pay the entirety of the award. At the hearing, plaintiff claims bifurcation
25 would be "unfair and misleading" if Mr. Navejar testifies to his relative poverty and it turn out that the
26 County of Kern will indemnify him. However, even if this is the case, whether the Court bifurcates
27 the issue of the amount of punitive damages, plaintiff's concerns would not be addressed. Indeed,
28 punitive damages may not be assessed against the entity. Thus, it would be incongruous with this state

1 of the law to suggest that the assets of the County of Kern should be considered or that the plaintiff
2 should be permitted to inform the jury that Mr. Navejar would not pay the award.

3 In any event, counsel reported that Mr. Navejar will not present evidence related to his
4 financial condition and counsel for the County of Kern confirmed that there has been no agreement
5 that it would pay any punitive award against Mr. Navejar and that no such decision would be made
6 unless there is such an award imposed. Thus, the Court will try the amount of punitive damages in a
7 second, though whether the plaintiff is entitled to these damages will be determined in the first phase.

8 The defense also seeks bifurcation of the Monell claims. The Court observes that attempting to
9 try the Monell claim at the same time as the individual claim poses the great potential to confuse the
10 jury. The jury may be tempted to impose liability on the individual for the wrongs of the entity, and
11 vice versa. In addition, Monell liability may not be imposed if there is no liability on the individual.
12 Thus, the court's resources and those of the parties as well as the valuable time of the jury would be
13 preserved if the Court proceeds with bifurcation.

14 Consequently, the Court is inclined to bifurcate the Monell claim, which includes the
15 "ratification" claim, but will await this determination until after briefs are filed addressing the extent to
16 which testimony would overlap between the phases, if bifurcation occurs. The plaintiff may file her
17 brief on the topic by **May 12, 2017**. If she files such a brief, the defendants may file their opposition
18 by **May 26, 2017** and the plaintiff may file an optional reply no later than **June 9, 2017**. **If the**
19 **plaintiff chooses not to file a brief on the topic, the Court will understand this to mean that the**
20 **plaintiff withdraws her objection to bifurcation.**

21 **S. APPOINTMENT OF IMPARTIAL EXPERTS**

22 None requested.

23 **T. ATTORNEYS' FEES**

24 The parties agree that the matter of the award of attorneys' fees to the prevailing party will be
25 handled by motion in accordance with Local Rule 293.

26 **U. TRIAL DATE/ ESTIMATED LENGTH OF TRIAL**

27 Jury trial is set for **June 26, 2017**, at 8:30 a.m. before the Honorable Jennifer L. Thurston at the
28 United States Courthouse, 510 19th Street, Bakersfield, California. Trial is expected to last 10-12days.

1 Counsel are reminded that issues that need to be raised outside of the presence of the jury
2 should be planned so that these discussions occur at times, such as breaks or before or after the trial
3 day, rather than when the jury is waiting. The Court will not allow the jury members to wait except in
4 exceptional circumstances, which do not include that counsel failed to adequately prepare in advance.

5 **V. TRIAL PROTECTIVE ORDER**

6 The parties request, and the Court **ORDERS**, that any protective order or agreements entered
7 into related to the handling of documents during discovery do not and will not apply to use of the
8 evidence/information at trial. The Court agrees that pretrial documents may be filed on the public
9 docket without seeking a sealing order but this does not preclude the parties from seeking a sealing
10 order as to specific documents. If this will occur, the Court expects a request to seal will be filed
11 immediately upon completing the meet and confer efforts related to motions in limine so as to not
12 delay the filing of the motions.

13 **W. TRIAL PREPARATION AND SUBMISSIONS**

14 **1. Trial Briefs**

15 The parties are relieved of their obligation under Local Rule 285 to file trial briefs. If any party
16 wishes to file a trial brief, they must do so in accordance with Local Rule 285 and be filed on or before
17 **June 9, 2017.**

18 **2. Jury Voir Dire**

19 The parties are required to file their proposed voir dire questions, in accordance with Local
20 Rule 162.1, on or before **June 9, 2017.**

21 **3. Jury Instructions & Verdict Form**

22 The parties shall serve, via e-mail or fax, their proposed jury instructions in accordance with
23 Local Rule 163 and their proposed verdict form on one another no later than **May 26, 2017.** The
24 parties shall conduct a conference to address their proposed jury instructions and verdict form no later
25 than **June 9, 2017.** At the conference, the parties **SHALL** attempt to reach agreement on jury
26 instructions and verdict form for use at trial. The parties shall file all agreed-upon jury instructions and
27 verdict form no later than **June 9, 2017**, and identify such as the agreed-upon jury instructions and
28 verdict forms. At the same time, the parties **SHALL** lodge via e-mail a copy of the joint jury

1 instructions and joint verdict form (in Word format) to JLTOrders@caed.uscourts.gov.

2 **If and only if, the parties after genuine, reasonable and good faith effort** cannot agree upon
3 certain specific jury instructions and verdict form, the parties shall file their respective proposed
4 (disputed) jury instructions and proposed (disputed) verdict form no later than **June 9, 2017**, and
5 identify such as the disputed jury instructions and verdict forms. At the same time, the parties
6 **SHALL** lodge via e-mail, a copy of his/their own (disputed) jury instructions and proposed (disputed)
7 verdict form (in Word format) to JLTOrders@caed.uscourts.gov.

8 In selecting proposed instructions, the parties shall use Ninth Circuit Model Civil Jury
9 Instructions or California's CACI instructions to the extent possible. All jury instructions and verdict
10 forms shall indicate the party submitting the instruction or verdict form (i.e., joint, plaintiff's,
11 defendant's, etc.), the number of the proposed instruction in sequence, a brief title for the instruction
12 describing the subject matter, the **complete** text of the instruction, and the legal authority supporting
13 the instruction. Each instruction **SHALL** be numbered.

14 **4. Statement of the Case**

15 The parties **SHALL** file a joint non-argumentative, brief statement of the case which is
16 suitable for reading to the jury at the outset of jury selection on or before **June 9, 2017**. In the event
17 they cannot agree on a joint statement, each side **SHALL** file a non-argumentative, brief statement of
18 the case on or before **June 9, 2017**.

19 **X. OBJECTIONS TO PRETRIAL ORDER**

20 Any party may, within 10 days after the date of service of this order, file and serve written
21 objections to any of the provisions set forth in this order. Such objections shall clearly specify the
22 requested modifications, corrections, additions or deletions.

23 **Y. MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS**

24 No later than **May 12, 2017**, ounsel for Mr. Navejar **SHALL** file a status report related to his
25 request for clarification of the Kern County Juvenile Court's order seeking consent to share all of the
26 California Welfare & Institutions Code § 827 documents with the other parties.

27 **Z. COMPLIANCE**

28 Strict compliance with this order and its requirements is mandatory. All parties and their

1 counsel are subject to sanctions, including dismissal or entry of default, for failure to fully comply
2 with this order and its requirements.
