14	The Court previously found service of the Second Amended Complaint appropriate.		
15	Accordingly, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(c), it is HEREBY ORDERED that:		
16	1. For each defendant to be served, the Clerk of the Court is directed to forward the		
17	following documents to the United States Marshals Service:		
18	a) One completed and issued summons;		
19	b) One completed USM–285 form;		
20	c) One copy of the amended complaint filed on 7/10/2017, plus an extra copy		
21	for the Marshals Service;		
22	d) One copy of this	order, plus an extra copy for the Marshals Service; and	
23	2. Within ten days from the	2. Within ten days from the date of this order, the Marshals Service is directed to	
24	notify the following defendant of the commencement of this action and to request a		
25	waiver of service in accordance with the provisions of Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(d) and 28		
26	U.S.C. § 566(c): Jose Colegio.		
27	3. The Marshals Service shall file returned waivers of service as well as any requests		
28	for waivers of service that are returned as undelivered as soon as they are received.		

4. If a waiver of service is not returned by the defendant within sixty days of the date of mailing the request for waiver, the Marshals Service shall:

a) Personally serve process and a copy of this order upon the defendant pursuant to Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and 28 U.S.C. § 566(c), and shall command all necessary assistance from the Tulare Police Department and/or the City of Tulare to execute this order. The Marshals Service shall maintain the confidentiality of all information provided by the Tulare Police Department and/or the City of Tulare pursuant to this order.

9 Within ten days after personal service is effected, the Marshals Service shall b) 10 file the return of service for the defendant, along with evidence of any 11 attempts to secure a waiver of service of process and of the costs 12 subsequently incurred in effecting service on said defendant. Said costs 13 shall be enumerated on the USM-285 form and shall include the costs 14 incurred by the Marshals Service for photocopying additional copies of the 15 summons and complaint and for preparing new USM-285 forms, if 16 required. Costs of service will be taxed against the personally served 17 defendant in accordance with the provisions of Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(d)(2).

5. If defendant waives service, he is required to return the signed waiver to the Marshals Service. The filing of an answer or a responsive motion does not relieve defendant of this requirement, and the failure to return the signed waiver may subject defendant to an order to pay the costs of service pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(d)(2).

- 6. In the event that defendant either waives service or is personally served, defendant
  is required to respond to the complaint.
