I. **Date of Scheduling Conference** 1 2 May 25, 2018. 3 II. **Appearances of Counsel** David Cohn appeared on behalf of Plaintiff. 4 5 Heather Cohen appeared on behalf of Defendants. III. **Pleading Amendment Deadline** 6 7 Any requested pleading amendments are ordered to be filed, either through a stipulation or 8 motion to amend, no later than September 14, 2018. IV. **Discovery Plan and Cut-Off Date** 9 10 The parties are ordered to exchange the initial disclosures required by Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(1)on or before June 18, 2018. 11 12 The parties are ordered to complete all discovery pertaining to non-experts on or before **June 18**, 13 2019, and all discovery pertaining to experts on or before August 12, 2019. 14 The parties are directed to disclose all expert witnesses, in writing, on or **June 28, 2019**, and to disclose all rebuttal experts on or before July 29, 2019. The written designation of retained and non-15 16 retained experts shall be made pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. Rule 26(a)(2), (A), (B), and (C) and shall **include all information required thereunder**. Failure to designate experts in compliance with this 17 order may result in the Court excluding the testimony or other evidence offered through such experts 18 19 that are not disclosed pursuant to this order. 20 The provisions of Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b)(4) and (5) shall apply to all discovery relating to experts 21 and their opinions. Experts must be fully prepared to be examined on all subjects and opinions included in the designation. Failure to comply will result in the imposition of sanctions, which may 22 23 include striking the expert designation and preclusion of expert testimony. 24 The provisions of Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(e) regarding a party's duty to timely supplement 25 disclosures and responses to discovery requests will be strictly enforced. 26 A mid-discovery status conference is scheduled for November 5, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. before the 27 Honorable Jennifer L. Thurston, U.S. Magistrate Judge, located at 510 19th Street, Bakersfield, 28 California. Counsel SHALL file a joint mid-discovery status conference report one week before the

Counsel may appear via teleconference by dialing (888) 557-8511 and entering Access Code 4 5 1652736, provided the Magistrate Judge's Courtroom Deputy Clerk receives a written notice of the intent to appear telephonically no later than five court days before the noticed hearing date. 6

V.

Pre-Trial Motion Schedule

All non-dispositive pre-trial motions, including any discovery motions, shall be filed no later than August 27, 2019, and heard on or before September 24, 2019. The Court hears non-dispositive motions at 9:00 a.m. at the United States District Courthouse in Bakersfield, California.

No motion to amend or stipulation to amend the case schedule will be entertained unless it is filed at least one week before the first deadline the parties wish to extend. Likewise, no written discovery motions shall be filed without the prior approval of the assigned Magistrate Judge. A party 13 14 with a discovery dispute must first confer with the opposing party in a good faith effort to resolve by agreement the issues in dispute. If that good faith effort is unsuccessful, the moving party promptly 15 16 shall seek a telephonic hearing with all involved parties and the Magistrate Judge. It shall be the 17 obligation of the moving party to arrange and originate the conference call to the court. To schedule this telephonic hearing, the parties are ordered to contact the Courtroom Deputy Clerk, Susan Hall, at 18 (661) 326-6620 or via email at SHall@caed.uscourts.gov. Counsel must comply with Local Rule 251 19 20 with respect to discovery disputes or the motion will be denied without prejudice and dropped 21

from the Court's calendar.

All dispositive pre-trial motions shall be filed no later than October 7, 2019, and heard no later 22 23 than November 18, 2019, before the Honorable Jennifer L. Thurston, United States Magistrate Judge, 24 at the United States District Courthouse in Bakersfield, California. In scheduling such motions,

25 counsel shall comply with Fed. R. Civ. P. 56 and Local Rules 230 and 260.

VI. Motions for Summary Judgment or Summary Adjudication

At least 21 days before filing a motion for summary judgment or motion for summary 27 28 adjudication, the parties are **ORDERED** to meet, in person or by telephone, to confer about the issues to be raised in the motion.

The purpose of the meeting shall be to: 1) avoid filing motions for summary judgment where a question of fact exists; 2) determine whether the respondent agrees that the motion has merit in whole or in part; 3) discuss whether issues can be resolved without the necessity of briefing; 4) narrow the issues for review by the court; 5) explore the possibility of settlement before the parties incur the expense of briefing a motion; and 6) to develop a joint statement of undisputed facts.

The moving party SHALL initiate the meeting and SHALL provide a complete, proposed statement of undisputed facts at least five days before the conference. The finalized joint statement of undisputed facts **SHALL** include all facts that the parties agree, for purposes of the motion, may be 10 deemed true. In addition to the requirements of Local Rule 260, the moving party shall file the joint statement of undisputed facts.

12 In the notice of motion the moving party **SHALL** certify that the parties have met and conferred as ordered above, or set forth a statement of good cause for the failure to meet and confer. Failure to 13 14 comply may result in the motion being stricken.
