

1 sanctions . . . within the inherent power of the Court.” The Court has the inherent power to
2 control its docket and may impose sanctions where appropriate, including dismissal of the action.
3 *Bautista v. Los Angeles County*, 216 F.3d 837, 841 (9th Cir. 2000).

4 Accordingly, Plaintiffs’ counsel Amber Hope Gordon is HEREBY ORDERED to
5 **personally appear** before United States Magistrate Judge Barbara A. McAuliffe at the United
6 States Courthouse, 2500 Tulare St., Fresno, California, Courtroom 8, on **Wednesday, February**
7 **12, 2020, at 9:00 AM** to show cause why this action should not be dismissed for failure to
8 prosecute and failure to comply with the Court’s orders dated January 29, 2019, and December
9 27, 2019. Counsel, however, may comply with this order by filing the status report by February
10 10, 2020.

11 **Failure to file the status report by February 10, 2020 or to personally appear before**
12 **the Court on February 12, 2020, will result in the recommendation that this action be**
13 **dismissed for failure to prosecute and/or failure to comply with the Court’s orders.**

14 IT IS SO ORDERED.
