**ORDER GRANTING DEFENDANTS’  
MOTION TO MODIFY DISCOVERY  
AND SCHEDULING ORDER**  
(Doc. 63)

Before the Court is Defendant’s motion to modify the Court’s discovery and scheduling order. (Doc. 63.) Defendants request that the discovery and dispositive-motion deadlines be extended until after the Court rules on their pending, exhaustion-based motion for summary judgment. (*See* Doc. 63-1 at 1, 4.) Also, due to restrictions imposed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, defense counsel anticipates that he will not be able to take Plaintiff’s deposition until early August. (*Id.* at 4, 5.) The time for Plaintiff to file an opposition or a statement of non-opposition has not yet passed, *see* Local Rule 230(1), but the Court deems neither necessary here.
