20	stipulations, Plaintiff filed her opening brief on November 4, 2016. (ECF No. 14.) Defendant has	
21	filed one stipulation requesting an extension of time to file her opposition brief. (ECF No. 15.) In	
22	that stipulation, Defendant agreed to file her opposition brief no later than January 19, 2017. No	
23	opposition brief has been filed to date and Defendant has not requested any further extensions.	
24	Defendant is thus ordered to show cause why sanctions, up to and including dispositive	
25	sanctions, should not issue for her failure to comply with court orders. Defendant is ordered to	
26	file a written response to this Order to Show Cause within 7 days of the date of this Order. If
