ORDER ADOPTING FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS GRANTING PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR CONDITIONAL FLSA COLLECTIVE ACTION CERTIFICATION AND ISSUANCE OF NOTICE

(Doc. 26)

The matter now pending before this Court is a putative collective action, filed on behalf of Plaintiffs, and other similarly situated individuals. On February 21, 2018, Plaintiffs filed a motion seeking conditional certification under the Fair Labor Standards Act ("FLSA"), 29 U.S.C. § 216(b). On April 10, 2018, the Magistrate Judge assigned to this matter issued Findings and Recommendations, recommending granting the motion and providing a fourteen day period within which to submit objections. To date, no objections have been filed.

In accordance with the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(C), this court has conducted a *de novo* review of this case. Having carefully reviewed the entire file, the court finds the

1 Findings and Recommendations to be supported by the record and by proper analysis.

2 For the reasons articulated in the Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations, IT  
3 IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 4 1. The Findings and Recommendations are ADOPTED in full; and  
5 2. Plaintiffs' motion for conditional FLSA collective action certification is  
6 GRANTED.
