17	Plaintiff Darren Vincent Ford ("Plaintiff") is a state prisoner proceeding pro se and in	
18	forma pauperis in this civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. On October 26, 2018,	
19	Plaintiff filed a first amended complaint, (ECF No. 34), together with a motion for the Court to	
20	direct the United States Marshal to initiate service of the complaint on the defendants, (ECF No.	
21	35).	
22	Plaintiff is advised that the Court is required to screen complaints brought by prisoners	
23	seeking relief against a governmental entity or officer or employee of a governmental entity. 28	
24	U.S.C. § 1915A(a). The Court will direct service of process only after Plaintiff's complaint has	
25	been screened and found to state cognizable claims for relief. Once the complaint is screened and	
26	found to have stated a cognizable claim against any defendant, a copy of the complaint will be	
27	sent to Plaintiff with service documents to be completed.

The Court screens complaints in the order in which they are filed and strives to avoid delays whenever possible. However, there are hundreds of prisoner civil rights cases presently pending before the Court, and delays are inevitable. Plaintiff's complaint will be screened in due course. Accordingly, Plaintiff's motion for service, (ECF No. 35), is HEREBY DENIED without prejudice, as premature. IT IS SO ORDERED. 1s/ Barbara A.
