Plaintiff Raymond Alford Bradford is appearing pro se and in forma pauperis in this civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983.

On January 18, 2017, the Court found that Plaintiff's complaint failed to state a cognizable claim for relief and granted plaintiff thirty days to file an amended complaint addressing the deficiencies identified by the Court. (ECF No. 9.) More than thirty days have passed, and Plaintiff has not complied with or otherwise responded to the order.
