

1 In applying to proceed *in forma pauperis*, a party must submit an affidavit that “state[s]
2 the facts as to [the] affiant’s poverty with some particularity, definiteness and certainty.”
3 *Jefferson v. United States*, 277 F.2d 723, 725 (9th Cir. 1960) (“The right to proceed in forma
4 paupers is not an unqualified one. It is a privilege, rather than a right”). The party “need not be
5 absolutely destitute to obtain benefits of the *in forma pauperis* statute.” *Id.* at 725. Nevertheless,
6 the affidavit must show that the party “cannot because of his poverty pay or give security for the
7 costs and still be able to provide himself and dependents with the necessities of life.” *Escobedo*,
8 787 F.3d at 1235 (citing *Adkins v. E.I. DuPont de Nemours & Co.*, 335 U.S. 331, 339 (1948)).

9 Here, Plaintiff has failed to state the facts of his poverty with particularity, definiteness
10 and certainty. Plaintiff states that he received money in the past 12 months, but fails to describe
11 the sources of money or state the amount received. Plaintiff also states that he does have things
12 of value, but does not know the value of it at this time. These statements fail to reach the level of
13 particularity necessary for the Court to determine Plaintiff’s indigency.

14 Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that:

15 Plaintiff must either pay the filing fee or file an amended *in forma pauperis* application
16 within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order. If Plaintiff files an amended application, he
17 must detail his assets and liabilities with particularity, definiteness and certainty to allow the
18 Court to determine whether he is unable to pay the filing fee.

19 **No requests for extension will be granted without a showing of good cause. Failure**
20 **to timely comply with this order will result in a recommendation that this action be**
21 **dismissed.**
