

1 *Thompson v. Housing Authority of Los Angeles*, 782 F.2d 829, 831 (9th Cir. 1986). A court may
2 impose sanctions, including terminating sanctions, for a party’s failure to obey a court order or failure
3 to comply with local rules. *See, e.g. Ferdik v. Bonzelet*, 963 F.2d 1258, 1260-61 (9th Cir. 1992)
4 (imposing sanctions terminating for failure to comply with an order); *Malone v. U.S. Postal Service*,
5 833 F.2d 128, 130 (9th Cir. 1987) (imposing terminating sanctions for failure to comply with a court
6 order); *Henderson v. Duncan*, 779 F.2d 1421, 1424 (9th Cir. 1986) (sanctions for failure to prosecute
7 and to comply with local rules). Accordingly, within 14 days, the Commissioner **SHALL** show cause
8 why sanctions should not be imposed for failure to follow the Court’s order. Alternatively, within 14
9 days, the Commissioner may file a response to Plaintiff’s opening brief.
