18	In this action, Jose Trujillo alleges 4B Market Incorporated; Kewal Singh Basi, Trustee of		
19	the Basi Family Revocable Trust; and Olga Basi, Trustee of the Basi Family Revocable Trust		
20	(collectively, "Defendants") violated of Title III of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42		
21	U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq.; the California Unruh Act, Cal. Civ. Code § 51 et seq.; and California		
22	Health & Safety Code §§ 19955, 19959. (Doc. 1)		
23	Plaintiff filed an amended motion for default judgment as to all Defendants. (Doc. 25.)		
24	The magistrate judge filed Findings and Recommendations, recommending Plaintiff's amended		
25	motion for default judgment be granted and directing the Plaintiff to mail a copy of the Findings		
26	and Recommendations to Defendants within fourteen business days of the date of the order. (Doc.		
27	28.) The Findings and Recommendations also	contained a notice that parties had fourteen days to	
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1	file written objections. (<i>Id.</i> at 14.) Plaintiff filed a certificate of service indicating that the Court's		
2	December 14, 2022 Order was served on Defendants. (Doc. 29.) As of the date of this Order, no		
3	objections have been filed and the time to do so has expired. (See docket.)		
4	According to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(C), the Court has conducted a de novo review of this		
5	case. Having carefully reviewed the entire file, the Court finds the Findings and		
6	Recommendations to be supported by the record and by proper analysis. Thus, the Court		
7	ORDERS:		
8	1.	1. The Findings and Recommendations, filed on December 14, 2022 (Doc. 28), are	
9	ADOPTED IN FULL.		
10	2.	The Clerk of Court shall enter judgment against Defendants as follows:	
11		(a) Plaintiff is awarded statutory damages in the amount of \$4,000.	
12		(b) Plaintiff is awarded attorney's fees, litigation expenses and costs in the	
13		amount of \$3,703.02.	
14		(c) Defendants shall remove barriers and provide:	
15		(1) a fuel pump or a communication device at the fuel pumps in	
16		accordance with 1991 ADAAG § 4.27.3;	
17		(2) an accessible entrance in accordance with 1991ADAAG	
18		§ 4.1.3(7)(a);	
19		(3) accessible aisles in accordance with § 1991 ADAAG § 4.3.3; and	
20		(4) an accessible transaction counter in accordance with 1991 ADAAG	
21		§ 7.2(1) consistent with the requirements of the ADA.	
22	3.	Thereafter, the Clerk of Court shall terminate any pending motions and close this	
23		case.
