**ORDER GRANTING REQUEST FOR  
SCREENING ORDER**

**ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF  
TIME TO FILE RESPONSE TO  
COMPLAINT**

**(ECF No. 1.)**

19 Omar Cabrera (“Plaintiff”) is a prisoner proceeding *pro se* in this civil rights action  
20 pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. This action was initiated by civil complaint filed by Plaintiff in  
21 the Fresno County Superior Court on October 25, 2021 (Case #21CECG03204). On January 5,  
22 2022, defendant California Correctional Health Care Services (CCHS) removed the case to  
23 federal court by filing a Notice of Removal of Action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1441(a) and 1446.  
24 (ECF No. 1.) In the Notice of Removal, Defendant requested the court to screen Plaintiff’s  
25 complaint under 28 U.S.C. § 1915A and grant Defendant an extension of time in which to file a  
26 responsive pleading. (*Id.* at 3 ¶ 6.)

27 The court is required to screen complaints in civil actions in which a prisoner seeks  
28 redress from a governmental entity or officer or employee of a governmental entity. 28 U.S.C.

1 § 1915A(a). Plaintiff's complaint alleges that Defendants, CCHCS, employees of CCHCS, and  
2 employees of Pleasant Valley State Prison failed to provide him with adequate medical care.  
3 Because Plaintiff is a prisoner and some of the Defendants were employees of the CDCR at a  
4 state prison when the alleged events occurred, the court is required to screen the complaint.  
5 Therefore, Defendant's request for the Court to screen the complaint shall be granted. In  
6 addition, good cause appearing, the request for extension of time shall also be granted.

7 Based on the foregoing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 8 1. Defendant's request for the court to screen the complaint under 28 U.S.C. §  
9 1915A(a) is GRANTED, and the court shall issue a screening order in due course;  
10 and
- 11 2. Defendants are GRANTED an extension of time until thirty days from the date of  
12 service of the court's screening order in which to file a response to the complaint.

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14 IT IS SO ORDERED.
