(ECF No. 17). The parties' stipulation states 18 that the parties have agreed that the Court shall retain jurisdiction to enforce the settlement 19 agreement. (ECF No. 17 at 1; see also id. at 4-11, Exhibit A, "Compromise Settlement 20 Agreement and Mutual General Release of All Claims" ¶ 16). 21 In light of the parties' stipulation (ECF No. 17), this action has been terminated, Fed. R. 22 Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A)(ii), and has been dismissed with prejudice. 23 Further, the Court will retain jurisdiction to enforce the terms of the settlement agreement 24 for no longer than six months from the date of this order. See Kokkonen v. Guardian Life Ins. Co. 25 of Am., 511 U.S. 375, 381-82 (1994)) (district courts may retain ancillary jurisdiction to enforce 26 settlement agreements). 27
