

1 prosecute. (Doc. 6.) Any objections were to be filed within 14 days. (*Id.* at 4.)

2 On December 26, 2024, Plaintiff filed a document titled “Objection to Magistrate Judge’s
3 Findings and Recommendations; Motion for Extension of Time (Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b); 72(a)).”
4 (Doc. 7.)

5 II. DISCUSSION

6 Plaintiff’s objections state he never received the Court’s November 15, 2024, order. (Doc.
7 7 at 2, 4.) He only became aware of the order on December 17, 2024, when he received the
8 Court’s Findings and Recommendations. (*Id.*) Without access to a printer, Plaintiff asked a friend
9 to obtain a copy of the November order for him. (*Id.* at 4.) Plaintiff states he has been unable to
10 complete a response to that order due to his “limited finances” and spending time “looking for
11 work or completing tasks which are necessary for [his] survival.” (*Id.*) He asks for an extension of
12 14-days to complete his response to the Court’s November 15, 2024, order. (*Id.*)

13 In light of the foregoing, the Court will vacate the Findings and Recommendations and
14 grant Plaintiff an extension of time within which to file a response to the November 15, 2024,
15 order.

16 III. CONCLUSION AND ORDER

17 Accordingly, the Court **ORDERS** as follows:

- 18 1. The Findings and Recommendations (Doc. 6) issued December 10, 2024, are
19 **VACATED**;
- 20 2. Plaintiff’s request for an extension of time is **GRANTED**; and
- 21 3. Plaintiff **SHALL** file a response to the Court’s November 15, 2024, order, **within 14**
22 **days** of the date of this Order. **A failure to comply with this Order will result in**
23 **reissuance of findings and recommendations to dismiss this action for a failure to**
24 **obey court orders and failure to prosecute.**

25 IT IS SO ORDERED.
